Ministry Team Reports:

Building & Grounds – Boyet Twitty presented two quotes. Session had approved the pouring of a cement pad to extend the take-out area for chicken and dumplings. Cost is \$1600.00 this was approved on the August 19, 2019 meeting by the session. The other quote was for \$2440.00 for a cement handicap ramp at the back door of sanctuary under the walkway. This work will be done by Keith Robinson. The session approved for Joey and Trisha McCombs to clean the church for \$400.00 per month. A check list was written up and would be presented to them to go by when cleaning weekly. They will begin cleaning the first week in October.

Christian Education – A Bible will be presented to Hailey Baucom during worship service on September 22, 2019. She was our only rising sixth grader. A new policy was presented to the session concerning church Christmas with Santa after our children's Christmas program. No gifts are to be brought and given out at this event. Santa will come and have a time with the children and give out candy canes. There will be a time for fellowship and finger foods. The children and youth Sunday School classes can still draw names as usual but the gifts will be passed out during Sunday School time. Session approved this proposal and we would appreciate everyone's cooperation please.

Congregational Care - Continue to pray for Jean Price, Travis Price, Robby Griffin and our military Chad Clontz and Devin Moser. Please contact Bob McCain with any congregational needs.

Fellowship – Trunk or Treat will be October 27, 2019.

Mission & Outreach – Thanks to all who help with Operation Outreach meals. More volunteers would be appreciated.

Worship – The worship committee reported they would be going back to using trays during communion so everyone would be served at their seats.

Old Business – A congregation meeting will be held on October 20, 2019. The purpose of the meeting will be to choose three people from the congregation to service on the nominations committee in choosing two candidates for elder. This committee will be made up of two from the

session and three from the congregation. The new elders would not start serving until July 2020. We are nominating early so we can give time for training of new elders to take place.

New Business – Larry and Audrey Schott are to meet with the session about joining Walkersville at the next session meeting on October 20, 2019. Preacher Paul Rankin will be on vacation from November 17 – 23. David Rankin is to meet with the session on October 20, 2019 to discuss setting up our church website.

There being no further business, Jim McGee made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Boyet Twitty seconded and session approved. The meeting was closed in prayer by Preacher Paul Rankin.

The meeting started at 12:00 noon on Friday, September 27th and was opened with a warm welcome by the moderator, Duke Lineberry. The first order of business at all Presbytery meetings is to break up in groups of 4 or 5 and pray. This is very unique and important of our Presbytery.
